Scholarships and Fellowships

Joint Japan/World Bank Graduate Scholarship Program (JJ/WBGSP) Regular Program

What: The World Bank, with funding from the Government of Japan established the World Bank Graduate Scholarship Program (WBGSP) for graduate studies in subjects related to economic development. Each year, the Program awards scholarships to individuals from World Bank member countries to undertake graduate studies at renowned universities throughout member countries of the Bank. The JJ/WBGSP scholarship provides annual awards to cover the cost of completing a master's degree or its equivalent.

Who: To apply for a JJ/WBGSP scholarship under the Regular Program, an applicant must:

- Be a national of a World Bank member country eligible to borrow.
- Be born after March 31, 1971.
- Have, by March 31, 2011, at least 2, preferably 4 to 5, years of recent full time professional experience acquired after a university degree, in the applicant's home country or in another developing country.
- Hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent.
- Not be a permanent resident or a national of any industrialized country.
- Not be residing in an industrialized country for more than one year.

When: Closing date is 31 March 2011.
